History

Prior to 1843 the church existed as a small chapel until it was considered too small to cope with the rising population.
William Nicholson from Thelwall Hall invited local people to

subscribe to the building of the church. He laid the foundation stone on 11th May 1843. His brother, James, added the chancel in 1856 and in 1890 further enlargements were carried out at the expense of Henry Stanton. The church contains some beautiful artworks. The reredos has paintings of Elijah the prophet, St Michael, St George and St Werburgh. There are many beautiful stained glass windows depicting the life of Christ, other Bible stories and of some of the Saints.

A painting of Christ in Glory occupies the whole of the chancel

arch. A triptych on the south wall, celebrating the coronation of King Edward VII tells the story of the founding of Thelwall.

It was executed by Eric Gill. In the baptistery there is a beautiful wall painting of St Christopher.



All Saints today

Today the church is very much part of the village community. The school is always welcomed as are all members of local groups. Special services such as Harvest, Christmas and Easter are very well attended. The church tries to serve the community by caring for the sick, the bereaved and the lonely.

Many people, apart from the regular congregation, have an attachment to All Saints Church. Some can attend services only occasionally; others were baptised or married here; others are visitors



or local residents who simply have an affection for their local church.
